

Lightroom 6 Library Module Missing Images

In my previous articles, I discussed the Development Module Subpanels. However, many of the questions, I am being asked are related to the managing of images in Lightroom (LR). Much of the image management activity will be accomplished using the Folders subpanel of the Library Module (LM) Today, I'm going to talk about "Missing Images," "How they occur" and "How to correct the errors".

"How Missing Images Occur" The first thing to understand is that LR doesn't actually con-



tain any of your images. They all exist on your computer disk storage in windows (or Mac) subdirectories. LR has a database with your image adjustment information and pointers to where your images are located. The only way an image will get into the LR database is when you import it. If you use Windows Explorer (or Finder on Mac) to move, load, rename, delete, etc. any of

your LR imported images or image folders, LR will not know what you did, and will still point where they use to be. LR will

recognize it can no longer find your images and flag the folders / images that are "missing" with a small "!" in the upper right corner of the image thumbnail in the filmstrip panel.



"How to Correct the Errors" If you click on the tiny

box on an image thumbnail with the "!," a message box similar to the one on the right will pop-up. If you click the "Locate" button, you will be placed in an Explorer (or Finder) win-



dow that will allow you to navigate to the renamed or moved image and select it. If you moved or renamed a directory you had previously imported to LR you will see a "?" at the beginning of the missing directory. Right clicking on the directory in question will open a pop-up window to remove the deleted directory from the catalog or open an explorer

(or Finder) window to allow selecting the renamed or moved directory.

Another way to identify your missing images is to first select a directory in the "Folders" subpanel of the LM. Then in the Library Module, click the Library tab (next to the Edit tab) at the top left of



your LR window and select "Find all Missing Photos" (See below). This will bring up a collection of missing images that can be searched for by clicking the "!" in the upper right-hand corner of one of the thumbnails as explained above. If you select your highest (or root) you will get all your missing images. When you select a missing image in its new location, any other missing images in the same location (folder) will be relinked as well.

There are many other actions associated with the Library Module that you can perform to clean-up

and manage your catalog. One of the easiest is to click on the File tab (upper left corner of the LR window) and select

"Optimize Catalog". This is a good thing to do after any significant catalog update, as it cleans up, reorganizes and shrinks the catalog (database), and generally speeds-up access to your images.



ASSIGNMENTS for 2017—2018

Images submitted for this category must have been taken after November 1, 2016. Assignment subject must occupy approximately 25% of the image area except on subject where specifically waived.

2017

APRIL---- Orange-the fruit or an object where the dominant (over 75%) color is orange.

MAY----- Fences- show an artistic view of a fence (note: the fence should cross through approx. 1/4th of the image rather than occupy that much of the total area) 25% rule waived.

JUNE---- Solo-person or object alone in a vast empty area-i.e. old barn in a big empty field- 25% rule waived for this assignment.

JULY---- Monument-photograph a monument in a creative manner not like the typical tourist shot

AUGUST- Inside-go inside something to find an interior picture, not necessarily inside a building.

SEPTEMBER- Beer- make a picture of anything from brewing to drinking the beverage

OCTOBER- Skyscraper- Photograph a tall building(s) in an artistic manner. Interior or exterior shot, your choice.

NOVEMBER- Athlete(s)- Show one or more athletes in action or before/after action *-- 25% rule waived for this subject

DECEMBER- Sphere(s)- subject is a round, 3-dimensional object

2018

JANUARY-- Bottle--Limitless possibilities with sizes, shapes, colors

FEBRUARY- Arches- Three are more arches, natural or man-made

MARCH--- Tree(s)-picture a tree, or trees or part of a tree



GSACC Board Meeting

January 4th, 2017 (repeat)

- 1. GSACC's first meeting of the new year. The following is a record of those who attended, Tim Kirkland, Dick Boone, Brian Duchin, Bill Hunsicker, John Kain, Jack White, Robert Moreno, Steve Manchester, and Peter Florczak.
- 2. Treasury status: The club's account shows a balance of 7,055.48.
- 3. First item of business was the proposal of the club purchasing a new laptop computer for use during our digital competitions. This laptop will be used and stored at Lion's Field, eliminating the burden of having a member bring the laptop to meetings. Brian and the Board members have agreed to set a budget of \$900.00 for a laptop, Adobe Lightroom, and an external hard drive.
- 4. Board has given the green light to proceed with obtaining a new website for the club. Research on this matter is conducted by John Kain, Peter Florczak, Brian Duchin and William Hunsicker.
- 5. Our new President, Brian, has proposed and the Board has approved a new judging strategy. This will help all GSACC members learn how to judge and critique more consistently. For a years time, permanent judges will be assigned for competitions, this will include board and committee members. From this pool, we expect members to rotate and judge competitions about 3 to 4 times throughout the year. This will enable us to build a stronger and more consistent pool of club members for all to learn how to critique a photo. The vision here is to build a training tool for all our club members.
- 6. The subject of disqualifying competition photo entries is a policy that has not been followed. From now on, any photograph in our competition that does not quality under the club's rules will be DISQUALIFIED prior to judging. 2 out of the 3 judges must agree that the image does not meet the standards for category and or rules.
- 7. March and April will see our TRAVEL photo category take center stage in our competitions. Definition of this category is based on geographic location and can be looked up through our website.
- 8. Print Chairman Dick Boone has brought up an important issue. Print photos that place in our competitions must be sent digitally to Dick, problem is that people send these digitized photos to Dick with different titles or other irregularities. This causes confusion and is too much work to correct, therefore, any images sent not meeting the correct requirements will be sent back to the photographer so he or she can correct the problem.
- 9. Brian has proposed our next Board meeting to be held on the same day prior to our monthly meeting. Board members agreed and the date will be determined soon.
