January Bottle(s)-limitless sizes, shapes, colors to use as a subject

February Arches-three or more arches, natural or man-made

March Tree(s)-venture outside to picture a tree, trees or a part of a tree

April Hot/fire-depict fire or something hot

May Missions-revisit the missions for a really different image, not the usual postcard shot

June Automotive-Subject should be an object that moves itself- car, train, plane, boat --all or part of it

July Fourth of July--Create a image that shows some patriotic theme. Does not need to be American Revolution in

nature. NO Fireworks, please.

August Time exposure-must be obvious that it is a time exposure. Image should include blurred movement that indicates it

meets the assignment.

## OUT OF FOCUS

One of the things I have always enjoyed about GSACC was its focus on making members feel welcomed and at home. So I was taken aback when I received an email from Cari Cline after the July competition meeting. After reading her email I realized that things have gotten out of focus. Here's the backstory on her email.

Cari, who joined our club a few months ago, entered an image titled "Tigress". Her photo was a black and white printed on metallic paper. (to see a copy of her photo download the 2018 July FLASH off of our website at <a href="https://www.gsacc.org/newsletters--links.html">https://www.gsacc.org/newsletters--links.html</a>.

The main subject was a semi nude side pose of a woman's torso and arms. Because of the silver treatment it looked like a metal sculpture. The subject's leg was raised, covering its genitals. The image was cropped so the subject's face was not revealed. One breast was exposed in the photo. There was muscle tone in the subject's arm. The lighting, tonal range and subject's posing were the perfect example of fine art photography. It won third place in monochrome. Two weeks before competition night Cari had asked me if it was okay to enter "Tigress". Fellow board member Peter Florczak and I reviewed the image on her phone. We agreed that it was okay for her to enter because it did not violate printed GSACC competition guidelines.

Immediately after the competition Tim Kirkland told me, "nudity is not allowed, it's an unwritten GSACC rule."

After I got home that evening I received this upsetting email from Cari. She wrote: "If I offended any members, I do apologize profusely. I received many angry looks and stares as I walked to my vehicle. I would like for the club to know that I did bring my image to two different board members two weeks prior to entering my image for judging. I did not enter the image thoughtlessly and without care. The purpose of art is to evoke emotion and thought. It's okay to disagree with an image and we can offer this as an opportunity to discuss changing or adding an addendum to what is allowed to be displayed at panel. I do like the club and have the utmost respect for you and Peter. However, I will not continue to belong to a club where members alienate and make a fellow photographer feel unwelcome because they do not agree with the content of an image. I was prepared to stand by my image but I was not prepared to be gawked at as I left tonight."

GSACC Board of Directors sincerely apologies to Cari. The Board regrets that some members would behave with intolerance and narrow mindedness over her photograph. The Board does not condone members harassing fellow members. This is against the core beliefs of GSACC. The Board of Directors expect members to treat each other with dignity and respect, despite differences. We hope that Cari will reconsider her decision.

P.S. This story has a happy ending. Carri contacted me and decided to continue her membership. This is certainly good news so please make Cari feel welcomed.
