ASSIGNMENTS for 2019

GSACC members the topic will be the same for two consecutive months with the odd-numbered months--January, March, May, July, September, and November -- prints months. The even numbered months will be projected/digital months.

For all categories the topic must occupy at least 1/4 the area of the image.

- **January--** Circle/round: Image must show a FULL 360 degrees of a circle or a 3-D round object. A two-dimensional, flat circle can be slightly ovoid, angles but not excessively so.
- February---Many colors-- A SINGLE subject with many colors.
- May-- Barn scene: Structure of a farm or ranch barn occupying 1/4 or more of the image. Can be all of the barn or a part of the structure. (Small backyard type tool sheds do NOT qualify for this assignment.)
- **June**---Above--Subject should be overhead of the photographer but NOT a picture of a ceiling or underside of a roof
- **September** Poem: Create a picture that could be used to illustrate a poem printed in a book. For example just from Robert Frost you can get- Mending Wall(a fence), Road Not Taken (country road), Birches (trees), Blueberries, The Telephone, etc., etc. Get out an anthology of literature and find many possible poems to illustrate.
- October---Multiple Textures--Several different textures should be present on the subject.

To Print or Not to Print — December 2018

To Print or Not to Print? That is the Question!

Next month is print month. We usually have much fewer entries and that got me thinking. If you look at a digital copy of a photograph your eyes might only linger on it for seconds. If it is a remarkable photograph you might give it a second, and then a third look. But let's be honest, after 15, or 30 seconds, and then you are on to the next image.

Now contrast that with a fine print. First, you labor on making and editing the image. Same thing with a digital image. But then you look for the perfect matte. Once matted, you like it so much, that you begin the hunt for a frame. Hang that image in your house, or study, or bedroom, or give it as a present, and it will be viewed over and over again. That image will be with you, or the lucky person who received it, for years. Each time that you share it with someone else, the "looking" at it becomes a whole new experience.

Not every image deserves to be printed and hung. How do you decide? Basically you have to print it. Sometimes over and over to get just right look, but at that point you are rewarded with an image that can truly stand the test of time. Your digital images eventually get lost on a hard drive filled with thousands of images, or on a Facebook page, where they might get a few "likes". A printed image is for ever.

This is why I love our GSACC's print competition. Every other month is print competition. By the way, this upcoming month of January is the next one. We always seem to have a nice full audience at the competitions, but I am usually dismayed with just how few entries we have. Some say it is the cost. Some ask, "What am I going to do with the print when the competition ends?" Look, I was recently off on a two week trip to the Oregon Coast. I probably shot a few thousand photos. I HOPED that I would get just 10 images that are worthwhile "keepers". I HOPED that I would get just one or two that are worth entering in the print competition, or possibly even hanging on my wall. But I know for past experience that I will probably need to print all 10 to make the final verdict. Hey, we are photographers and that is what we do!

As for the cost, I print my own. I am not particularly wealthy, so I look for the deals on paper and ink, and yes, even a photo printer. (\$40 for a 13" wide Canon printer with paper!) Putting it all together I have less than \$2 in a 13"x19" print. I can afford that for something that I love this much. If you are having trouble putting it all together, then ask me at the next meeting, or call or email me.

As for mattes, I use the same white mattes over every time. I have been using them for the last 2 years. That's 12 times and still going strong. So I encourage you to give it a try. Who knows, you might just create that masterpiece you have always dreamed of, and then you will have it as a reminder of what a great experience that was for a long, long time.

Dues are due in January of each year. Individual membership is \$30.00/year and family membership is \$40.00/year.
